




THE GARDENS

In April 2019, after a major restoration project, Leonardslee Lakes & Gardens opened for visitors to enjoy. Set in a steep-sided valley, the gardens offer visitors a variety of scenic walks, with its seven interlaced lakes, extensive woodlands and lovely parkland.

There is an acclaimed Pulham rock garden built in 1890, deer park and colony of wallabies that wander throughout the estate.

The 240-acre estate features outstanding displays of rhododendrons, azaleas, camellias, magnolias and bluebells in spring, summer wildflowers and beautiful autumnal colours from September to late November. It is a joy to visit at any time of the year.

Plants were collected from all over the world since the early 1800s. The collection is exceptional in its diversity and maturity, with several rare 'champion' trees, threatened in their natural habitat.



THE ROCK GARDEN

With its variety of conifers and foliage, the famous Rock Garden, created in 1890, offers spectacular spring colours which turn beautiful shades of greens, blues, yellows and bronze as the seasons change to autumn. The lichens and moss create fascinating shapes and colours on the 125-year-old Pulhamite rocks.



Spring

From March to June the garden comes alive in a riot of colour. With magnolias towering 40 feet high, camellias in groves, footpaths winding through carpets of bluebells, many hundreds of rhododendrons including several rare species - and later in the season the show of azaleas. It is a sight to behold.

At every turn, you will find flowers in so many different colours - all set within the beautiful woodland backdrop.

Deep in the valley, this array of colour is reflected within the lakes, creating breathtaking views.



Summer

In the summer, Leonardslee Lakes & Gardens is particularly beautiful, vividly colourful and full of life. The trees and plants in full bloom, produce bright displays. Perfect for picnics.

There are many different rare acer trees (maple trees) in Leonardslee Lakes & Gardens that have unusually shaped, feathery leaves in a variety of colours and distinctive, attractive bark. Among the 100 different species of oak trees found in Leonardslee Lakes & Gardens, we have a collection of 30 non-native ones, from around the world.

Bird watchers and wildlife enthusiasts love visiting Leonardslee Lakes & Gardens during the summer months. We invite you to take a moment to sit still and quietly observe the myriad of wildlife.



Autumn

As the summer draws to a close, Leonardslee Lakes & Gardens takes on a whole new guise. In autumn, the trees create beautiful displays, their leaves turning into a variety of colours, which create stunning reflections in the valley lakes.

Hundreds of varieties of trees can be found throughout the estate, and it is not only their leaves which command attention, but their bark also looks just as stunning in this season, contrasted against the backdrop of the beautiful autumnal colour.




Winter

Leonardslee Lakes & Gardens becomes a winter wonderland during December, January and February. The deciduous trees take on a majestic appearance and the garden becomes even more tranquil. On dry, frosty mornings the gardens are truly magical in the early mist - every photographer's dream.

Many migrant birds come to shelter and feed on the berries at Leonardslee in the winter. And a variety of smaller birds can be seen to flock around the gardens.

This is a great time to spot our feathered friends as they can be clearly seen among the bare trees, and particularly against any snow. Visit the fascinating Dolls' House Museum and tea rooms.



THE WALLABIES & WILDLIFE

Our colony of Bennett's Wallabies are descendants of the original herd brought here by Sir Edmund Loder in 1889.

Wild wallabies can often be spotted foraging in the gardens, or simply resting in the sun. Visit the wallaby enclosure to be guaranteed a sighting; you may even spot the rare white one. Take a wander through the Deer Park for the chance to catch a glimpse of the many deer that roam the estate.

The gardens offer a protected ecosystem for rare wildlife including Emperor Dragonflies and Damselflies, White Admiral and Purple Hairstreak butterflies. You can see migratory and native birds - Kites, Great Tits, Tree Creepers, Nuthatches, Woodpeckers and Nightingales. The seven lakes are a major attraction for birdlife. Migrating ducks fly over them, and cormorants can be seen diving for fish. Whilst waders such as Snipe and Woodcock might be spotted in the woods, with birds of prey circling overhead.




LEONARDSLEE ART GALLERY & SCULPTURE PARK
